Your First 100 Days: Arms Dealers and Wedding Wine

1 Kings 9:15-16, 10:25-26; Deuteronomy 17:14,16-17; Isaiah 25:6, 55:1; John 15:1.4-8

"Here is the account of the forced labor King Solomon conscripted to build the Lord's temple, his own palace, the terraces, the wall of Jerusalem, and Hazor, Megiddo and Gezer. (Pharaoh king of Egypt had attacked and captured Gezer. He had set it on fire. He killed its Canaanite inhabitants and then gave it as a wedding gift to his daughter, Solomon's wife. Year after year, everyone who came brought a gift—articles of silver and gold, robes, weapons and spices, and horses and mules. Solomon accumulated chariots and horses; he had fourteen hundred chariots and twelve thousand horses, which he kept in the chariot cities and also with him in Jerusalem."

(1 Kings 9:15-16,10:25-26)

"When you enter the land the Lord your God is giving you and have taken possession of it and settled in it, and you say, "Let us set a king over us like all the nations around us...The king must not acquire great numbers of horses for himself or make the people return to Egypt to get more of them...He must not take many wives, or his heart will be led astray.
